

ardar Vallabhbhai Patel, Independent India's first Deputy Prime Minister, endorsed the idea that true strength emanates when people unite in harmony. Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat

Sardar Patel's Vision **Takes Shape**

ardar Patel gave us 'Ek Bharat'. It is now the solemn duty of all Indians to collectively make

Shreshtha Bharat," Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi reminded the people of India on October 31, 2015, while commemorating the birth anniversary of the first Union Home Minister Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, who was instrumental in unifying the country by merging 562 Princely States into the Indian Union.

In order to fulfil the goals of national unity inspired by Sardar Patel's vision, Prime Minister Shri Modi announced a solemn mission of 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat' on that day. The purpose of the programme was to further strengthen the connection between the people of the States and Union Territories of the country, to enhance mutual understanding and bonding among people of diverse cultures for our unity amidst diversity.

In 2014, the Union Government led by Prime Minister Shri Modi announced Sardar Patel's birthday to be celebrated as 'National Unity Day' and the Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat campaign became an instrument on the ground to fulfil the





goals of national unity through cultural exchanges among the States. While launching the Ek Bharat, Shreshtha Bharat initiative, the Prime Minister had propounded that cultural diversity was a joy that ought to be celebrated through mutual interaction and reciprocity between people of different States and Union Territories.

Embracing the principle of 'Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam', the Prime Minister aims to establish harmony across the world too, and seeks to carve new dimensions of development by bringing the country and the world together on one platform.

Like in previous years, Prime Minister Shri Modi paid his tribute to Sardar Patel on his 148th birth anniversary on October 31. He stated that Sardar Patel gave a new dimension to our country's destiny with his indomitable spirit, visionary political skills and extraordinary dedication. In his post, the Prime Minister wrote, "On Sardar Patel's birth anniversary, we remember him for giving a new dimension to our country's destiny. His commitment to national unity always guides us and we will always be indebted to his

service." A grand ceremony was organised in Kevadia, Gujarat, to convey the message of 'Unity in Diversity'. On this occasion, development projects worth ₹160 crore were also launched.

The inaugurated projects included a heritage train from Ekta Nagar to Ahmedabad, a project related to the live Narmada Aarti, Kamalam Park, a pedestrian path within the Statue of Unity, 30 new e-buses, 210 e-cycles, a city gas distribution network in Ekta Nagar and the Sahakar Bhavan of the Gujarat State Cooperative Bank. Additionally, the Prime Minister laid the foundation stone for a trauma centre and a subdistrict hospital equipped with solar panels in Kevadia.

Earlier in the day, Prime Minister Shri Modi participated in the National Unity Day celebration parade. The parade included contingents from the Border Security Force (BSF) and various state police, an adventurous show by the Central Reserve Police Force's (CRPF) female bikers, a women's pipe band of the BSF, a choreographed performance by the Gujarat Police, a special NCC show, school band performances, and a flypast by the Indian Air Force demonstrating

the economic viability of vibrant villages. Addressing a gathering, the Prime Minister said that National Unity Day celebrates the power of unity of India's youth and its warriors. Despite different languages, cultures and traditions, every individual in the country is bound by the strong thread of unity.

"There are many pearls, but the necklace is one. We may be diverse, but we are united", the Prime Minister said, adding that just as August 15 and January 26 are recognised as Independence Day and Republic Day respectively, October 31 has also become a festival of unity across the country. The celebration of Independence Day at the Red Fort, the Republic Day Parade at Kartavya Path and the National Unity Day celebration in the vicinity of the Statue of Unity at the banks of the Narmada have become a trinity of national resurgence.

Prime Minister Shri Modi said that visitors to Ekta Nagar (Kevadia) not only marvel at the Statue of Unity but also get glimpses of Sardar Patel's life and his contribution to India's national unity. The Statue of Unity represents the ideals of 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat'. He emphasised that the creation of the Unity Wall using a mixture of soils from different parts of India at Kartavya Path is symbolic of this intermixing of people of different parts of the country for national unity. In fact, after gaining Independence, the biggest effort towards unity in the country was made by Sardar Patel by integrating Princely States into India's federal system.

On October 31, 2022, Prime Minister Shri Modi had said that Sardar Patel's birth anniversary and Unity Day are not just dates on the calendar; they are a grand celebration of India's cultural strength. The Prime



Minister, who was in Kevadia, emphasised that unity is essential at every level, whether it be the family, society or the country. "The entire country is drawing inspiration from Sardar Patel's firm resolve. Every citizen is taking the pledge to awaken the nation's unity. It is difficult to imagine what the situation would have been like if our freedom struggle had not been led by leaders such as Sardar Patel. What would have happened if the integration of more than 550 Princely States had not taken place?" he said.

The Prime Minister credited Sardar Patel for envisioning that every Indian would have equal opportunities and a feeling of equality. "Today, the country is witnessing the realisation of that dream", he added.

During the last nine years, India has prioritised every section of society that had been neglected

Janjatiya Gaurav Divas

Under the leadership of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, the Government has declared November 15 as 'Janjatiya Gaurav Divas' to commemorate the significant contributions of tribal communities in the country. In 2021, the Union Cabinet officially endorsed November 15 as 'Tribal Pride Day' as part of the commemoration of 75 years of India's Independence, aiming to pay homage to courageous tribal freedom fighters. The date coincides with the birth anniversary of freedom fighter Bhagwan Birsa Munda. The celebration not only honours all tribal freedom fighters but also seeks to invigorate efforts for the socio-economic development of tribal areas and communities. The observance of 'Janjatiya Gaurav Divas' marks a commitment to ensure essential facilities, employment and education for tribal populations residing in remote areas and villages. As a sign of respect to the tribal community, the garden at the Bureau of Police Research and Development (BPR&D) headquarters in New Delhi has been named 'Birsa Munda Udyan'.


for decades. The country has started the tradition of celebrating 'Janjatiya Gaurav Divas' on the birth anniversary of Bhagwan Birsa Munda on November 15 to recognise the prideful place of the tribals in India. The Prime Minister said that tribal museums are being constructed in many States across the country. He urged the countrymen to learn about the history of Managarh Dham and Jambughoda.

Prime Minister Shri Modi has said on several occasions that people across the country have always had a clear concept of the nation and that Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat has been prevalent for thousands of years in practice. Whether it was Adi Shankaracharya centuries ago or Swami Vivekananda in modern times, India has always stood for Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat.

The establishment of the Ramakrishna Mission is also linked to the idea of 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat'. The Ramakrishna Mission has carried out extensive relief and rescue work all over the world, he said.

During a programme organised on the 125th anniversary of the Ramakrishna Math in April, the Prime Minister had said that on the famous rock in Kanyakumari, Swami Vivekananda had searched for





the purpose of his life, which changed him and its impact was felt in Chicago. Later, when he returned from the West, he first set foot on the sacred land of Tamil Nadu. The king of Ramnad honoured Swami Vivekananda with great enthusiasm, and when the Swami came to Chennai, it was a very special event. Swami Vivekananda, hailing from Bengal, was welcomed as a hero in Tamil Nadu. This occurred long before India gained Independence. It shows people across the country have always had a clear concept of India. For thousands of years, the sentiment of 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat' has been a cornerstone in India's unity.


The Union Government's philosophy is also inspired by Swami Vivekananda, the Prime Minister said. "Earlier, even basic facilities were considered a privilege of a few. Many people were deprived of the benefits of progress. Now, the door of development is open for everyone", he added.

Over time, various traditions have developed in the country for unification of the nation in accordance with the circumstances. These traditions enhance the strength of our culture and continually rejuvenate it.

After the abrogation of Article 370 and 35A in Jammu and Kashmir, the efforts of the Union Government brought many aspects of the region to the attention of the country. The people began to benefit from Central Government programmes, the Prime Minister said.

India is a country made up of various cultures, languages, dialects and arts, but if one looks closely, the soul of all these is one, and that is the soul of India. On December 16, 2022, at Banaras Hindu University, the Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation, Shri Amit Shah, said that by organising the Kashi Tamil Sangamam, Prime Minister Shri Modi has made an excellent effort in the year of the Amrit Mahotsav of Independence to rejuvenate the cultural unity of India. Referring to history, the Union Home Minister said that after coming from the south, Adi Shankaracharya received acceptance for his Brahma Sutra Bhasya among the scholars of Kashi.

Kashi Tamil Sangamam Harmonises Cultural Diversity



he Kashi Tamil Sangamam was inaugurated by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi on November 17, 2022, under the auspices of the Union Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Culture and culminated on December 16, 2022, with an address by the Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation, Shri Amit Shah. The event also saw the presence of Union Education Minister Shri Dharmendra Pradhan and Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Shri Yogi Adityanath. Various organisations, including the Uttar Pradesh Government, played a cooperative role in making this event a success, with Banaras Hindu University and IIT Madras acting as special partners. The primary objective of this event was to rekindle the ancient bonds between Tamil Nadu and Kashi. The festival witnessed active participation from over 2,500 delegates representing diverse backgrounds, including classical and folk artistes, writers, entrepreneurs, farmers, religious leaders, and athletes from Tamil Nadu.

ollowing the departure of the British in 1947, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel undertook the monumental task of uniting more than 550 Princely States, crafting the present map of India. In honour of his contributions, his birth anniversary on October 31 is celebrated as 'National Unity Day' across the country.

To commemorate his 148th birth anniversary, the Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation, Shri Amit Shah, participated in various programmes. In the presence of President Smt Droupadi Murmu, Vice-President Shri Jagdeep Dhankhar, Minister of State for External Affairs and Culture Meenakshi Lekhi and Delhi Lieutenant Governor VK Saxena, Shri Shah paid tributes to Sardar Patel at his statue in Patel Chowk, New Delhi. Additionally, the Union Home Minister flagged off the 'Unity Run' at Major Dhyan Chand National Stadium, which was organised as part of the 'National Unity Day' festivities.

Reflecting on Sardar Patel's contributions, Shri Shah said that since 2014, the entire nation has annually observed his birthday as 'Unity Day'.

Highlighting the visionary role played by Sardar Patel, Shri Shah underscored the transformative impact Patel had on shaping India's current map. He stressed on the fact that post-Independence, Sardar Patel's determined





efforts swiftly united 562 Princely States, establishing India's respected global position.

According to Shri Shah, Patel's resolute commitment, patriotic duty and firm intentions have paved the way for realising the vision of 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat'.

The Union Home Minister shared Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi's call to the nation during the Amrit Mahotsav of Independence, urging collective determination and effort over the 25 years between the 75th and 100th year of Independence for significant accomplishments. He emphasised the need for a collective pledge from the 140 crore people of India to build a nation that excels in every global domain by the year 2047 when India celebrates the centenary of Independence.

Shri Shah said that Sardar Patel was a 'Karma Yogi', who translated his vision into reality. He continuously worked for India's Independence, the creation of a united India and laying the foundation of a 'New India'. For a long time, attempts were made to diminish his legacy as it took many years to honour him with the Bharat Ratna, build his memorial and create an inspiration for young children by compiling his thoughts.

Acknowledging Sardar Patel's monumental role in uniting India from Kashmir to Kanyakumari, the Home Minister expressed gratitude, noting that the country can never fully repay his debt. He also highlighted Prime Minister Shri Modi's tribute to Patel through the construction of the world's tallest statue in Kevadia in Gujarat.

Shri Shah said that it is the result of Sardar Patel's determination, devotion to duty towards the nation and intentions as solid as iron that today India stands with respect in front of the world after 76 years of Independence. He said it was Sardar Sahib who with his skillful and unique political acumen united the whole country. "Even at that time anti-national forces had left no stone unturned in dividing the country, but it was due to the efforts of Sardar Sahib, that we see the integrated map of India, as it is today", he said.

from diverse regions reached Delhi, accompanied by lakhs of Indians taking the 'Panch Pran' pledge and sharing selfies on the campaign website.

During the closing ceremony, Prime Minister Shri Modi introduced the 'Mera Yuva Bharat' platform, specifically designed for the youth of the nation. The Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation, Shri Amit Shah, also actively participated in the event.

In his address, the Prime Minister, drawing from a Sanskrit verse, emphasised that the conclusion of one chapter marks the beginning of something new. He associated the launch of 'Mera Yuva Bharat' with the culmination of Amrit Mahotsav, declaring it as the embodiment of India's youth power. Significantly, the Amrit Mahotsav has bridged historical gaps for future generations, marking the completion of a transformative journey from the Rajpath to the Kartavya Path during the Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav campaign. The Prime Minister emphasised the aspiration to set a new record for public participation in this monumental celebration, linking the significance of the Dandi March reigniting the flame of Independence with the resolution embodied in the 75-year development journey of Amrit Kaal.

Despite India's Independence, enduring symbols of past subjugation persisted for many years, only to be eradicated under the adept leadership of the Prime Minister. Examples include the installation of Netaji Subhas Bose's statue at India Gate, the introduction of the new Navy insignia, the renaming of islands in Andaman and Nicobar and the declaration of Tribal Pride Day. Shri Shah engaged in the closing ceremony of the Meri Maati, Mera Desh campaign. On this occasion, he highlighted the significance of Sardar Patel's birth anniversary, noting the collection of sacred soil from across the country. n October 21, 1959, the CRPF faced an intense and sudden ambush by a sizable Chinese force at the Hot Springs area in northeastern Ladakh. The determined CRPF unit, despite being vastly outnumbered, held their ground. The skirmish led to the tragic loss of 10 brave CRPF personnel.

Even when faced with superior numbers and weaponry, their bravery was unmatched. The 10 soldiers who made the ultimate sacrifice that day not only immortalised Hot Springs as a sacred ground for the CRPF, but also marked the date as a day of remembrance for the entire paramilitary force. This fateful day is now remembered and honoured as 'Police Commemoration Day' across India.

In its formative years, the CRPF was tasked with the perilous mission of safeguarding the Indo-Tibetan border near Aksai Chin. Their dedication and sacrifices

during this period remain a beacon of inspiration. Since 1953, a company of the CRPF assumed the duty of monitoring Leh in Ladakh and its adjoining border posts. Despite the challenging conditions—the vastness of the Aksai Chin region, the formidable terrain, the desolation of the barren mountains, and the piercing cold winds the CRPF remained undeterred in their vigil.

The martyred soldiers were Imam Singh, Puran Singh, Narbu Lamba, Bejraj Mal, Makhan Lal, Shivnath, Hanjeet Subba, Dharam Singh, Sharwan Das and Tshering Bolkhu Norbu.

Kartavya Path

Kartavya Path is a ceremonial avenue that stretches from Rashtrapati Bhavan (the President's official residence) to India Gate. Kartavya Path is also a walkway designed to symbolise the importance of duty and responsibility towards the nation. It serves as a reminder to citizens of their roles as responsible individuals and the unity that comes from fulfilling one's duties towards



society and the country. Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi inaugrated Kartavya Path on September 8, 2022. Earlier this area was known as Rajpath.





Netaji's Statue

The statue of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose stands tall at the historic India Gate, which is also situated on the Kartavya Path. National War Memorial

National Police Memorial



The Prime Minister personally assumed the role of the first passenger on the Namo Bharat train, getting a digital ticket and embarking on the journey.

The rapid train is designed to reach a speed of 180 kmph, with an operational speed of 160 kmph.

The initial 80-kilometre stretch from Delhi to Meerut marks just the beginning, as the Namo Bharat trains will soon connect various regions in Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Haryana and Rajasthan in the first phase. He articulated plans for replicating a similar system in

other parts of the country to enhance connectivity and generate employment opportunities.

A budget of ₹2.5 lakh has been allocated to transform winning ideas/proof of concepts (PoC) into products, fostering incubation, encouragement and funding for practical tools and solutions benefiting law enforcement agencies.



- ♦ You can donate directly to individual braveheart's account (upto max of ₹15 lakh) or may donate to the Bharat Ke Veer corpus.
- ♦ To ensure maximum coverage, a cap of ₹15 lakh is envisaged per braveheart and the donor would be alerted if the amount exceeds ₹15 lakh, so that they can choose to either decrease their contribution or divert part of the contribution to another braveheart's account, or to the Bharat Ke Veer corpus.
- ♦ Bharat Ke Veer corpus would be managed by a committee made up of eminent persons and senior government officials, in equal number, who would decide to disburse the fund equitably to the braveheart families on a need basis.
