1.1.1 – Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

Curriculum Delivery (2018-19) The effective implementation of curriculum is ensured by supplementing, classroom, teaching, group assignments, e-learning, and seminars. This college is government institute affiliated to CRSU University Jind. The university provides academic calendar and syllabii of U.G. and P.G. courses in all the three streams, viz. Science, Art and Commerce for effective implementation of the curriculum, the college strictly adheres to university guidelines. He senior-most faculty member is member of Board of Studies for framing syllabi of English for the sessions 2018-19 and 2019-20. At the very outset of session the general timetable is made and distributed amongst teachers, who prepared lesson plans in advance and inform the students. The students are engaged in several classroom activities such as group discussion, paper presentation, two classroom test and internal assessment and co-curriculur activities also. The time table ensured equitable distribution of time to different subjects and activities. Teachers and students know in advance their roles as well as the time they are to devote to each activity. The computers and other lab facilities are used by all the enrolled students in the practical groups. The sports facilities are made available to students and the expert advice of the faculty members of the Dept. of Physical education is always with them. The students are motivated to make use of library and the library reading rooms are almost full round the day. Not only the facilities available with the college are utilized fully for catering the interests of students, but the college also has a well set mechanism to maintain and improve them. The college has a clear, sequenced plan for curriculum delivery that ensures consistent teaching, learning and assessment procedures. Thus the college has clear reference for monitoring learning.
