Curricular Activities (2019-20) As an affiliated College of Chaudhary Ranbir Singh, University (CRSU), Jind the syllabi/curriculum is designed and prescribed by the University. In an affiliating system, the College has to implement the curriculum designed by the University. Two senior faculty members of this college, one in Department of Political Science and the second in the Department of English are members of Board of Studies of the respective subjects for framing syllabus. To ensure the effective implementation of the curriculum, efforts are made through constitution of various committees for preparing comprehensive time table and lesson plans which are displayed on the notice boards and also uploaded on the college web-site. The CBCS pattern in PG Courses was followed by the universities in the Haryana. We offer Three PG and Three UG programmes (semester pattern) having 08 departments in Arts (English, Hindi, Sanskrit, History, Punjabi, Political Science, Geography and Economics), 6 departments in Science (Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Botany, Zoology and Computer Science) 1 in Commerce Faculty. The College also integrates the crosscutting issues into the curriculum and also aims at empowering the stakeholders by giving opportunities to submit feedback on the syllabus and its transaction for curriculum enrichment. Consequently, with this aim, The College also establishes a formal system of feedback (feedback collected, analyzed and action taken and feedback available on website) from various stakeholders i.e. students, teachers, employers and alumni.
